Capturing a Bat: What You Need To Know

Items for a Bat Capture Kit


- Heavy gloves, preferably pliable and made of thick leather.
- Kitchen tongs or forceps, 9" to 12" in length.
- A coffee can or similar container, preferably with a tight-fitting lid.
- A sheet of cardboard.
- Tape.
- A net with fine mesh and a long handle.
- A flashlight to locate the bat without scaring it and causing it to fly around.

When to Capture a Bat

- If there is any possibility that a
 person has come into contact with
 the bat, even if no visible wounds are
 present.
- If the bat is found near an unattended child, a sleeping person, someone with a sensory or mental impairment, or a pet.













How to Capture a Bat

Using a Container

- 1. Close all doors and windows to the room, then wait for the bat to land.
- 2. Approach slowly and place a container over the bat.
- 3. Slide a piece of cardboard between the wall and the container, lifting both away from the wall as a unit.
- 4. Carefully slide the cardboard off the container while simultaneously securing the appropriately sized lid.
- 5. Tape the lid to the container to prevent the bat from escaping, and label it to avoid accidental opening.
- 6. Contact your local board of health for further instructions.

Using a Net

- Bats are highly sensitive to movement, so approach from behind.
- Use a fine-mesh net with a long handle to capture the bat.
- Transfer the bat to a container using forceps or while wearing thick leather gloves.
